Implementation, Monitoring, Review and Mutual Accountability

- Follow-up monitoring mechanism a continuously evolving process to reinforce partnerships and mutual accountability
- LLDCs and Transit developing countries have to be mutually accountable for actions to improve transit processes
- Regional Reviews should be informed by the National Reviews
- Global Reviews should take into account Regional and Sub Regional Reviews and National inputs.
- National, Sub-regional and Regional Reviews will get feedback from Global Reviews to strengthen implementation and mutual accountability.

Implementation, Monitoring and Review: **National Level**

- LLDC governments should mainstream the new programme of Action into their national and sectoral development strategies.
- There is need to strengthen (or establish) national institutional mechanisms for coordinating the national level implementation, monitoring and review (i.e. National committees, establishment of national trade facilitation committee/national transit coordinator)
- Implement and conduct regular reviews.
- Involve the private sector.

Implementation, Monitoring and Review: **Sub-Regional Level**

- Implementation, monitoring and review at bi-lateral and sub-regional levels is important.
- Mainstream the implementation of the Programme of Action into the relevant programmes of work of the sub-regional organizations
- Strengthen coordination mechanisms – regional monitoring committees
- Develop and implement relevant priority projects – eg. infrastructure development to improve connectivity and trade facilitation initiatives
- Private sector involvement.

Implementation, Monitoring and Review: **Regional Level**

- The relevant United Nations regional economic commissions should undertake periodic reviews in close cooperation with countries and sub-regional organizations.
- Regional organizations, regional development banks, regional UN organizations should be broadly involved.
- LLDC Programme of Action should be mainstreamed into development assistance and funding.
- Private sector involvement.

Implementation, Monitoring and Review: Global Level

- Annual review by the General Assembly of the implementation of the new Programme of Action (Annual reports of the Secretary-General, matrix and indicators to measure progress of achievements and level of commitment).
- Review of implementation of the Programme of Action through ECOSOC
- Incorporate into UN global agenda (post-2015 development agenda, SDGs, high-level political forum)
- Biannual GA plenary interactive thematic dialogue, sectoral and thematic reviews.
- Governing bodies of the organizations of the UN system to mainstream the implementation of the Programme of Action within their programmes of work.
- Better coordination and coherence in the UN system.
- Private sector involvement is important.

The Role of UN-OHRLLS

- To assist the UN SG in ensuring the full mobilization and coordination of the UN system in the implementation, follow-up, monitoring and review
- To provide coordinated support to the GA and ECOSOC reviews.
- Establish linkage among national, regional and global follow up and review processes
- To mobilize international support and resources
- Coordinate UN system and other system organization efforts
- Monitor and report on the progress
